However special sessions are available in some subject areas for teachers with more than three years experience.

TUITION

Tuition is \$425 per session for all subjects except World History (\$435 + \$40 for field trip) and Spanish Language (\$435). A \$100 deposit is required to hold your slot in any session; payment in full will also guarantee your enrollment. Full payment is due by July 1 for all sessions.

THE INSTRUCTORS

ENGLISH LITERATURE AND COMPOSITION

(NEW): Jolinda Collins has 20 years experience as an AP English teacher, 10 years as a College Board consultant, six years as an AP Reader and six years as an AP Summer Institute instructor. She teaches four classes of AP English and also instructs staff development courses in writing across the curriculum, using critical thinking skills and gifted certification.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE AND COMPOSITION AND ENGLISH LITERATURE AND COMPOSITION

(NEW AND ADVANCED): David Waters has taught AP English Literature and English Language classes in Connecticut, Wisconsin and Louisiana since 1967. Recently retired from Isidore Newman School in New Orleans, he is a registered AP consultant for the Southeast region of the College Board. He was a member of AP English Development Committee, 1966-70 and 1974-80, serving as chair from 1976-80 during the preparation for the new English Language course and examination.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE AND COMPOSITION

(NEW): Margaret Cross Rice earned her B.A. in English and her master's from Florida Atlantic University. She has taught in Palm Beach County for 28 years. She has been teaching AP Language for 12 years and has been a reader for the AP exam since 1994. She has served as a College Board consultant for three years and was an AP Language consultant at the University of Central Florida 1999 Summer Institute.

EUROPEAN HISTORY (ALL) AND WORLD HISTORY (NEW)

(NEW): Larry Treadwell has been a European History teacher for over 18 years during which time 90% of his students have earned a 3 or higher on the national exam. He has conducted college board workshops since 1990, has served as a reader for the national exam for four years and has been a table leader for the past three years. He presently teaches at Ely High School and has been a Broward County, Florida Teacher of the Year.

MUSIC THEORY (ALL): Don Ellis has taught Music Theory for 16 years at The Career Center, a magnet school in Winston-Salem, N.C. He has been a reader for AP Music seven years running. He has also been a consultant for the College Board for seven years. He has attended state, regional and national conferences on AP Music Theory and has taught in AP Institutes at Agnes Scott college two years in a row. He has a B.M., M.M. and an Ed.D.

PSYCHOLOGY (NEW): Hugh Canterbury has taught AP Psychology for over 10 years and has served as a reader for four years. He has received the Golden Apple award for teaching excellence at Griffin High School on three occasions. He has conducted one-day workshops in Georgia, Florida, Virginia, North Carolina and Kentucky and one-week workshops in Kentucky (for six years) and North Carolina. His students have achieved an 85% passing rate over the past five years with two-thirds (44 students) scoring a 4 or 5 this past year. He received his B.S. from Berry College and M.Ed. and Ed.S. from Georgia State University.

SPANISH LANGUAGE (NEW): Ken Stewart earned his B.A. from University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. He has spent several sessions abroad in Mexico and Spain and is fluent in Spanish and proficient in Portuguese and French. He has over 15 years of teaching experience in Spanish. He has served as an ESL instructor, a Spanish teacher at Chapel Hill High School, a Spanish instructor at UNC-Chapel Hill, a business manager of a Spanish language school and presently teaches Spanish at Cary Academy. He has won many awards in teaching and has a variety of publication and presentation citations. He has taught AP Spanish for 15 years and has been a College Board consultant for nine years.
